EARLY ON THE FIRST DAY OF THE WEEK

Today we celebrate the highpoint of the Christian Calendar, Easter. The Gospel tells us that Mary Magdalen is the first witness to the Resurrection, she is the first to bring this *Good News* to others, the first preacher of the Resurrection.
