You are beloved...

Jesus' baptism by John the Baptist had a different meaning from ours. It was more a baptism of sorrow for sin and of forgiveness; in this plunge into the river, Jesus identified with his people in his baptism.

At the baptism he heard the best words he could hear; *You are my beloved*. God led Jesus to John to hear these words. One of us, one with us, he could now be one for us. No offence should be taken if someone prefers to express a non-contact Sign of Peace.
